P R E F A C E

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The adopted scheme (Introduction, Commentary, Appendices, Indexes) as such is conventional and hardly need be accounted for. A few comments on the introduction and the commentary may however be appropriate in this connection.

The *introduction* contains a synthesis of the general conclusions that can be drawn from the detail analysis of the material presented in the commentary. Far from trying to exhaust the information of the letters, I have concentrated on a number of carefully selected topics that bear on the understanding of the letters as a whole. This was all the more imperative as in many cases widely current opinions about these questions obviously were in need of revision or precision.

The purpose of the *commentary* is twofold. On one hand, I have tried to clarify difficult passages by adducing illustrating parallels or other evidence from other, mostly contemporary sources. On the other hand, I have done my best to point out the relative or absolute certainty of the text and translation given by me². This implied a thorough grounding of all major restorations (especially concerning the assignment of letter fragments to definite authors) and questionable translations (especially those deviating from authorities such as CAD and AHw; quite obvious mistranslations and misinterpretations of earlier editions are passed over in silence); the numerous philological and historical discussions serving for this purpose are registered in the indexes. Whenever sufficient astronomical or historical criteria are available, I have endeavoured to establish the exact date of each document, and the line of argumentation is presented in the commentary in proper connections; otherwise the general time limits deduced in the introduction have to be applied. The comments on each

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² The most vexing feature in the earlier editions, particularly in that by Waterman, is certainly their poor philological quality and the frequent 'nonsense-translations' resulting from it. With regard to the suspicions and scepticism awoken by such translations, it is simply imperative to demonstrate with all desirable clarity what translations are possible and what not.

letter are preceded by a list of the extant photographs, copies (other than ABL) and scholarly contributions that have appeared after 1930¹.

The main body of this volume dates from 1968; chapters III and IV of the introduction, and parts of chapter II, were written after my release from military service in 1969. In order to keep the manuscript up to date, I have later on inserted new material and rewritten some sections.²

I repeat my thanks to all persons and institutions whose assistance was acknowledged in Pt. I. Furthermore, I want to thank my wife for her loving help, Prof. K. Deller (Heidelberg) for reading through the introduction, and especially the editors of the series AOAT for the outstanding generosity and elasticity shown to me during the printing of this book.

4. Neo-Assyrian grammar and vocabulary

The date there is no adequate presentation of either the Neo-Assyrian grammar or vocabulary. Especially the latter has been badly neglected, the only extensive list of words available being the one published in the fourth volume of RCAE (which besides being incomplete, is to a large extent unreliable and does not distinguish between NA and NB words). The main features of the NA grammar are worked out in S. Ylvisaker, *Zur babylonischen und assyrischen Grammatik*, eine Untersuchung auf Grund der Briefe aus der Sargonidenzeit (= LSS 5/6, Leipzig 1912). Despite its undeniable merits, this study is now out-of-date, owing to the considerable growth of the textual material. A new, comprehensive grammar is in preparation by K. Deller. Until its completion, Neo-Assyrian students have to resort to their own collections and the scattered lexical and grammatical studies that have appeared during the two past decades. In the case of exorcism, medicine and lamentation science, only general information is given, since relatively few of the letters deal with these subjects.
